Issue Details

Location of Issue:	A3102 at Mile Elm
Community Area:	Calne
Parish or Town Council:	Calne Without Parish Council
Nature of Issue: Traffic slowing / calming measures, and warning signs	
<p>The A3102 in Mile Elm has a very dangerous double bend, located by Wayside, Mile Elm House and Milestone Cottage. Today, 1-Feb-22, saw another accident whereby an out-of-control car smashed through the protective fencing of Wayside. Paramedics, police, and fire officers had to attend to a written off car and 2 impacted people, as well as my property. I know there has been a fatal accident in almost the same spot in the past. The traffic is way too fast for a narrow, sharp double bend.</p>	
How long has it been an issue?	I have no start date – years and years. There have been calls for traffic calming in this area previously.
What would you like done to resolve this issue?	
<p>Ideally, there has to be enforced slowing down for the approach to the bend, <i>from both directions</i>. We cannot keep seeing accidents in this spot. The existing warning signs are insufficient and ignored. If physical measures really cannot be imposed (why not?), then please at least erect the boldest and brightest fluorescent arrows all the way round the bend. You can put this on my border fence if you wish (once it has been rebuilt). You're more than welcome to visit to examine the severity of this issue, and I'll happily share photos from today's accident to support this plea. Thank you.</p>
