## Grant Application Calne Without Parish Council

We are a carving and woodworking club situated in an old barn behind the Lansdowne Arms in Derry Hill. We have been in operation for in excess of 15 years and have grown our membership to 30 in pre-covid times to the extent that we needed to control membership numbers. We currently have 22 paying members but with enquiries from potential new members.

Woodworking and carving, requires very sharp tools, and our existing sharpening system uses stone grinding wheels which need periodic maintenance and care as they get worn and out of true.

We would like to replace our grinding stones with diamond wheels which stay flat and true and require little maintenance. We want to replace both existing wheels with two different grades of diamond wheel and in addition to the diamond wheels we would like an additional Jig to allow us to sharpen on the side of the wheels.

We would also like to replace our third hand, elderly and much used thicknesser with a new DeWalt thicknesser.
