Residents failed (in 2011?) to persuade Calne town council to establish a 30 mph speed limit, apparently because of low housing density here, and yet this is a neighbourhood in the traditional sense, and not just a thoroughfare with houses on it. The volume and speed of traffic here are now surely far more relevant considerations than the number of houses.
