After speaking with local residents there was a Barn dance arranged in Heddington on the same night to which Stockley residents had already been invited to. I thought it would be better to merge with them as we are going to become one parish in the near future and it's a good way to promote the good work our Parish council does for the community in our wards.

I liaised with the organiser Duffy - A local gentleman who independently organises events for the community. Duffy is in his early nineties. He often organises these events and has done over many years. The queen's jubilee, the wedding of Prince William and Kate,

Live band £ 350

Tables and chairs rental £300

Bunting and decorations £ 200

Tickets £40

This comes to a total of £3180

Ticket sales so far is £2200 (220x £10)

leaving £980 still to pay.
