Calne Without Parish Council is offering free trees to residents to plant (up to three trees per household). This will help make your garden wildlife-friendly, bring shade and diversity, and make a small contribution to helping with climate change and biodiversity.

We will be supplying the trees as small “whips”, with spiral guards, canes, and a guide to good planting technique.

Just sign up below, with an indication of your preferred species. As we’ll be getting a mix of species, we will do our best to meet your preferred choice, but we can’t guarantee it.

The trees will be distributed in November (during the best time of the year for planting). We’ll be distributing them from the Lansdowne Hall car park (and other points around the village) at set times, which we’ll advise in due course.

### **Crab Apple.**

Crab apple trees are associated with love and marriage and its small, hard fruits make excellent jelly.

Estimated full-grown height = 7-9m



### **Field Maple.**

Field maple trees produce 5-lobed leaves that turn a rich golden yellow colour in autumn.

Estimated full-grown height = 15-20m



### **Goat Willow.**

Also known as pussy willow, the male catkins of the goat willow look like cats' paws.

Estimated full-grown height = 6-10m



### **Guelder Rose.**

The guelder rose brightens woods with spring blossom, autumn colour and vibrant berries.

Estimated full-grown height = up to 4m



### **Rowan.**

Fern-like leaves which turn burnt red in autumn. In spring there are clusters of creamy-white flowers followed by striking orange-red berries in autumn.

Estimated full-grown height = 8-15m



### **Hazel.**

Catkins resembling lambs' tails, and late-summer nuts, loved by squirrels and hazel dormice.

Estimated full-grown height = 10+m



### **Silver Birch.**

Silver birch is a striking tree which provides food and habitat for over 300 species of insect.

Estimated full-grown height = 15-20m



### **Wild Cherry.**

Wild cherry displays clouds of blossom in spring and its bright summer fruits bring a splash of vivid colour.

Estimated full-grown height = 18-25m
