

Proposal to transfer CIL money from Chilvester Hill to Calne and Bremhill Council

Strategic Planning Committee Nov 2023

- 1. It was agreed in the CGR discussions that unallocated CIL money from developments that sit on the border between Calne Without and another parish should be transferred to them, with 70% going to the parish in which the development resides (Calne in this case) and 30% to the one the other side of the border (Bremhill).
- 2. Local councils have 5 years to spend the CIL before Wiltshire Council can demand it back.
- 3. Calne Without Parish Council (CWPC) has just received the first tranche of three in relation to the Chilvester Hill development (£15,436.20).
- 4. CWPC is highly unlikely to spend this money and will therefore have to distribute it to in line with point 1 in early 2025. This would deprive Calne and Bremhill of access to the money for one and a half years, during which they could have planned to spend it. This would effectively give them only 3 ½ years to spend the money.
- 5. It seems unreasonable to withhold the money for 1 ½ years.
- 6. I propose that the money is transferred to the successor councils as soon as the asset distribution proposals are ratified by Wiltshire Council.
