# VE Day 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Commemoration Road Closure Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> May

## 1. Background

2025 will be the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Victory in Europe Day, which marked the end of the Second World War in Europe and the first step towards building a world based on international law, cooperation between nations and respect for human rights.

The Derry Hill and Studley Community Committee are organising a series of events to mark the anniversary. These include:

- Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> May exhibition in the Lansdowne Hall followed by a 1940s themed dance in the
  evening.
- Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> May village picnic.
- Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> May beacon lighting at Bowood.

On Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> May, a Remembrance Sunday type event is being organised, involving a parade to the war memorial with a short ceremony to remember from the village who made the ultimate sacrifice between 1939 and 1945. This will be followed by a church service.

The Parish Council has been asked to organise a road closure.

#### 2. Proposal

It is proposed that the Council organises a road closure between the Church and along Church Road and Studley Lane to the junction of the A4, for 10am to 11am on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> May 2025.

Wiltshire Council has confirmed that they will waive charges for this closure.

In order to ensure that the closure is managed safely, we are required to engage a professional company to provide signage for the diversion, and to submit and agree the signage schedule with Wiltshire Council in advance of the closure.

## 3. Estimated Cost

Quotes have been sought and the cost of the signage will be £976 plus VAT.

### 4. Recommendation

It is recommended that the Council arranges for the closure of Church Road / Studley Lane from the Church to the junction with the A4, for 10am to 11am on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> March, at an estimated cost of £976 plus VAT. As this hasn't been budgeted for as part of next year's Public Participation Budget, it is recommended that the value be transferred across from the £5,000 provision for community groups.
